TUTORS



Tom Wilkinson is University Organist and Director of Chapel Music at the University of St Andrews. He is currently researching the music of J.S. Bach and his composer sons for a PhD at the University of Glasgow. Under his direction St Salvator's Chapel Choir have toured throughout Europe and received critical acclaim for their CD recordings

Henry Fairs is Honorary Professor of Organ at the Head of Organ Studies at Birmingham Conservatoire. A prize-winner at the international competitions of Chartres, Paris, St Albans and Odense, he performs and records throughout Europe and beyond.



Oliver Salandini is Organiste *Titulaire* and Artistic University of St Andrews and Director of *Riches heures* de l'orque en Berry, a post he combines with that of Professor of Harpsichord and Basso Continuo at Limoges Conservatoire. A former pupil of René Saorgin and Jean-Luc Etienne at the Nice Conservatoire, Salandini won prizes at the international competitions of Lausanne and Herford.



Graham Mark Scott is Assistant Director of Music at Bryanston School. A multi prize-winning graduate of the former Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama, Graham went on to obtain a Premier Prix from the Toulouse Conservatoire as a pupil of Jan Willem Jansen and Michel Bouvard.



Edmund Aldhouse is Assistant Organist at Ely Cathedral. Following studies at Oxford, he became a pupil of Frédéric Blanc and François-Henri Houbart at the Conservatoire of Rueil-Malmaison from where he graduated with a Premier Prix avec Virtuosité in 2008.



Neil Cockburn is Director of Music at the Cathedral Church of the Redeemer (Anglican) in Calgary, and Instructor of Organ at the University of Calgary. His studies in Oxford and at the RNCM in Manchester were followed by the obtaining of a Premier Prix de Perfectionnnement from the Conservatoire of Rueil-Malmaison and a PhD from the University of Calgary. Neil also won first prize at the Dublin International Organ Competition in 1996

The Auld Alliance ASPECTS OF THE FRENCH Organ Culture





For many years, organists have made their way to the picturesque surroundings of St Andrews to improve their core skills and be inspired to broaden their horizons. In recent years our organ week has grown in ambition and repute and we now regularly welcome participants from throughout the UK and well beyond.

In 2017, we immerse ourselves in the organ culture of France. In addition to the French organ literature of the 19th and 20th centuries, participants can enjoy the

opportunity to learn about the unique language of the French classical organ and to experience playing a genuine art harmonium, an instrument vital to understanding the 19th century French organ culture, under the expert guidance of Anne Page. We will also offer memorable concerts: Durufle's complete organ works with Henry Fairs, the beautiful Aubertin organ at King's College, Aberdeen in the hands of Bourges Cathedral titulaire Olivier Salandini, while Neil Cockburn and Edmund Aldhouse recreate the recital Marcel Dupré gave at Dundee's Caird Hall in May, 1924. As if that weren't enough all participants will have the chance to learn the basics of Gregorian Chant and to sing in a Parisian-style Vespers service as it would have been in the 1920s and '30s.

If you are passionate about playing the organ, no matter your age or standard, we hope you will consider joining us.
